English, with only 26 letters, has approximately 44 distinct sounds known as phonemes. These sounds are essential for distinguishing between different words and their meanings. To represent these sounds, we use various letters and combinations of letters called graphemes.

The 44 English sounds can be divided into consonants and vowels. Below is a compilation of the 44 phonemes, their corresponding International Phonetic Alphabet symbols, and examples of their usage. It's important to note that there is no definitive list of phonemes due to accents, dialects, and language evolution. As a result, you may encounter lists with more or fewer than these 44 sounds.
